

Morris H. Wolf

Morris H. Wolf, 71, Real Estate Developer and Fisherman.

On October 14, 2005, Morris H. Wolf of **Baltimore, Maryland**, beloved husband of Barbara H. Wolf, of Baltimore, loving father of Deborah Wolf, of Middlesex, VT, Cynthia Wolf, of Rushford, MN, Pamela Wolf, of Brookline, MA, Kimberly Wolf Kupfer, of Camp Hill, PA, Elizabeth Wolf, of Redding, CT, and Christopher Chiapparelli, of New York City, died of acute leukemia. Morris also leaves five sons-in-law, Anthony Pollina, Kelley O'Neill, Leo Sorokin, Charles Kupfer, and David Morgan, and 15 grandchildren.

He graduated from Forest Park High School, attended Duke University and graduated from the University of Baltimore Law School, passing the bar at age 21. He then served in the United States Army.

Morris Wolf was a real estate developer for over 50 years. His projects ranged from single-family, affordable homes in Harford County to shopping centers in Minnesota. The crowning achievement of

his real estate development career was the creation of The Club at Patriot's Glen, an 18-hole championship golf course located in Elkton, Maryland. On October 10, he held a charity fundraiser for victims of Hurricane Katrina at the golf course. Morris was honored to partner in these endeavors and others with his nephew and protégé, Jim Wolf, who will continue in the operation and business affairs of Morris H. Wolf Enterprises. Jim defined Patriot's Glen as "the capstone of Morris' career, and his proudest professional achievement." Trent Wright, the Director of Golf at Patriot's Glen, convened a memorial luncheon for his family at the Elktowne Tavern on Monday, stating, "Elkton and this whole area are better today because of Morris Wolf's vision and desire to build this beautiful project. He really loved this place."

Morris mentored many young men from all walks of life, leading to the formation of an ongoing social club, "The Sons of Morris."

In recent years, Morris divided his time between Baltimore, Ocean City, and North Key Largo, Florida to pursue his passion for deep-sea fishing. But he worked until the end of his life, with Patriot's Glen being his latest accomplishment.

Morris was an extraordinary man with a heart of gold who lived and loved life voraciously. His passions included family, fishing, work, sports, travel, and thoroughbred horses. He was an ardent fan of all Maryland teams.

He now joins his parents, Ida and Chauncey Wolf, formerly of Baltimore, and his brothers, Van Wolf, formerly of Nassau, Bahamas, and A.J. Wolf, formerly of Baltimore, who departed this life ahead of him.
